His arc consists in overcoming this timidity and finding his voice.
- **Protagonist 1:** A visionary filmmaker with grand ideas but no resources. This character drives the group's ambitions.
- **Protagonist 2:** A skeptical realist who often plays the voice of reason but can't resist getting dragged into the chaos.

Recurring Characters:

• **Studio Heads:** Satirical caricatures of Canadian political archetypes (Liberal, Conservative, and NDP) representing traditional and modern aspects of the film industry.

- **Makeup Artist/Executive Assistant:** A recurring female character who keeps the group grounded and often offers practical advice.
- Josh Blecher (from Less Than Kind): A recurring guest star. Josh is cast as the lead in the TV series produced within the show. His character's humor and relatable nature bring an added layer of comedy and depth to the series, while tying Less Than Kind into the Canada-verse.
- **Other Iconic Characters:** The show will feature appearances and guest spots by characters from other well-known Canadian TV shows such as *Trailer Park Boys, Corner Gas,* and *Schitt's Creek.* These characters will seamlessly integrate into the storyline, preserving the spirit of their original shows while contributing to the humor and heart of *The Great Canadian Fluke.*

Episode 1: Lights, Camera, Eh!

The pilot episode introduces the characters, their shared dream of building the film industry in Kelowna, and the comedic chaos of their brainstorming sessions. - **Canadian Identity:** A playful exploration of Canadian culture, stereotypes, and creativity.
